ELEMENT	EVIDENCE REQUIRED
1. Check for danger	<input type="checkbox"/> Look for hazards and risks
2. Infection Control	<input type="checkbox"/> Utilises standard infection control precautions
3. Arrange help	<input type="checkbox"/> Have a bystander call for the ambulance on triple zero (000) <input type="checkbox"/> Arrange for a Defibrillator if available
4. Self protection issues	<input type="checkbox"/> Be aware of manual handling risks associated with first aid
5. Assess the casualty	<input type="checkbox"/> Provide effective assertive questioning <input type="checkbox"/> Provide calm information to the casualty
6. Ambulance/medical response	<input type="checkbox"/> Arrange someone to call triple zero 000 <input type="checkbox"/> Or mobile 112 <input type="checkbox"/> Use available resources to make the victim comfortable <input type="checkbox"/> Seek assistance from others as soon as possible <input type="checkbox"/> Provide an effective handover to paramedic using concise details of what happened/ what you have done
7. Perform a casualty assessment	<input type="checkbox"/> Seek consent from the casualty prior to commencement of first aid <input type="checkbox"/> Have a base line treatment plan in order to effectively arrange support from others <input type="checkbox"/> Provide first aid as required
8. Skills required from the first responder	<input type="checkbox"/> Use safe manual handling skills <input type="checkbox"/> Listening skills & record changes in condition of the victim <input type="checkbox"/> Provide effective feedback to the victim <input type="checkbox"/> Be able to demonstrate sensitively <input type="checkbox"/> Provide empathy for all especially those from a diverse ethnic and cultural backgrounds <input type="checkbox"/> Continually monitor the casualty <input type="checkbox"/> Seek feedback from the health care professional <input type="checkbox"/> Duty of care responsibilities <input type="checkbox"/> Privacy considerations
9. Consider cultural differences when applying first aid to the injured	<input type="checkbox"/> Have an understanding of some of the differences other cultures may have eg male first aider looking after a female victim. <input type="checkbox"/> Consideration to swap victims with same sex first aiders
